Summary: Understanding and managing the risks of climate extremes is an important challenge for Australian scientists, planners and politicians. At this two-day symposium, experts will give presentations and participate in panel discussions focused on three aspects of climate change:

The physical science: The observational record, major climate drivers for Victoria, the science of climate change projections and extreme weather events.

Impacts on Victoria: The impacts on public health, water supplies for cities and agriculture, and sea level rise and coastal inundation.

Adaptation to climate change: How adaptation addresses ways to reduce exposure and vulnerability to a changing climate and its impacts. Adaptation also increases resilience to potential adverse impacts of climate extremes.
